PROCEDURE AND POLICY FOR PERMISSION TO PUBLISH BORROWED MATERIAL

Stem Cells can publish borrowed material only with written permission of the original publisher. If you use illustrations and tables in your manuscript that are obtained from other sources, you must obtain permission from the original source for each. Secure these permissions as soon as possible. To assist you in this process, here is a helpful checklist to follow for each permission required.

- _____ Request permission from the **publisher**. If the author owns copyright, the publisher will direct you to write the author for permission. Some publishers also require permission of the lead author as a condition for use.
- _____ Send a copy of the relevant illustration or table with your request.
- _____ Keep a copy of each permission letter with the copy of the illustrations/tables for which you are requesting permission.

- _____ Read contracts carefully. If indicated, complete, sign, and return to the publisher for co-signing. In general, any fee required for permission is the responsibility of the author.
- _____ Retain a copy of each signed contract for your files and include a photocopy with your manuscript. All permission documentation, including proof of payment of any necessary fee, must be provided at the time of manuscript submission.
- _____ Include a credit line for the borrowed material in the legend. (e.g., From Koch C, Gerald P, Platt JL. Immunosuppression by Embryonic Stem Cells. *Stem Cells* 2008;26:89-98, with permission.)

When writing the Permissions Editor, include the following verbiage: "I am writing an article entitled < > for the publication entitled, < >, to be published by AlphaMed Press. I would like to borrow the material (a copy of which is attached) as outlined below."

- Mention the number of the figure or table in the original publication and the page on which it appears.
- For illustrations borrowed from a journal, state the name of the author(s), title of article, volume number, pages, and year.
- For illustrations borrowed from a book, state the name of the author(s), title of chapter, names of the editors of the book (if different from author(s) of the chapter), title, edition of the book, place of publication, publisher, and year.
